## EQ5 WORKSHOPS

Saturday, May13, 2006 (after our Grand Feast) there will be an Electric Quilt 5 (EQ5) demonstration at The Sew'n Place from 4:30 to 5:30 pm. This is a FREE demonstration but you must sign up. No laptops will be required, just attend with an open mind. Dottie will demonstrate the flexibility and possibilities of EQ5.

This year's Friendship Block is an example of the advantage of using EQ5. Have you seen the 6 quilt layouts for Donna's quilt? Dottie created them for us on EQ5.

Guild members have an opportunity to learn EQ5 hands-on. EQ5 is a computer quilt design software program. Dottie Moreland will be teaching a beginner class Saturday, May 20, 2006 at The Sew'n Place. This EQ5 class is a basic, beginner class. Students will need a laptop computer and the EQ5 program if

they have it. If they don't have EQ5, a program will be loaded on the computer but will be uninstalled before leaving class at the end of the day. This is necessary because of copyright agreements. Two people can work together on one laptop.

If you aren't sure whether you want to purchase the program or not, this class will help you decide if you would use it or not. This is an all day (10 am to 3pm) workshop.

## CREATIVE PEOPLE NEEDED... COUNCIL FOR THE ARTS

Regional artists and crafts people are invited to create banners to be displayed in downtown Chambersburg during this summer's ChambersFest celebrations. Banners will hang from the light poles along Main Street, adding color and movement to the festivities downtown. Designs for banners should be submitted to the Council for the Arts no later than May 2. Entry forms can be obtained by calling the Council at 717-264-6883.

"Artists - both individual and groups - are invited to create banners - that celebrate the arts, summertime, our area and its history," explained Anne Finucane, the Council's Gallery Director, "or whatever inspires them!" Banners need to be 33 inches by 98 inches, with a 30-degree angle cut from the left side, as in the IceFest banners hung on the Square

in February. Designs must be visible from both sides (both sides need not be identical); banners with religious, partisan or commercial messages will not be accepted. All components of design and construction must be securely attached. Banners must not weigh more than 20 lbs., and must be able to be rolled up for storage purposes.

Banners are due at the Council for the Arts by 1:00 on Saturday, July 8. For an entry form and complete specifications, please call or stop by the Council. For more information about the Council and its work, call 264-6883.

## MAY QUILT BEE

Please note the quilt be location was changed from Jean Druckenbrod's home to Dottie Moreland's home. The Quilt Bee will be held May 22 from 9:30 am to 2:00 pm with Dottie Moreland (717-263-1476) as hostess.

### Directions to Dottie Moreland's home:

Coming from Chambersburg, take Route 11 North. At the Franklin Diner turn left

(northwest) onto the truck route. At the traffic light at the entrance to Cumberland Business Park (Letterkenney) turn left onto SR-997. Travel about 1 mile. At the top of the hill (Air Hill Church on your left), turn right (northeast) onto Smith Road. Travel about 1/2 mile. At the stop sign, turn left onto Nyesville Road. Pass the first 3 houses on your left and turn left into Dottie's driveway (do not pass the right hand curve). Dottie's address is 7641 Nyesville Road. Her driveway is about 300 feet long.

### Directions to Linda Schwalm's home:

Travel north on I-81 to Scotland Exit 20. At the stop sign at Exit 20, turn left (north) onto SR-696. Travel less than one mile. Pass Orchard Road and a white fence on your right. Turn right onto Coldsmith Road (left turn is Pine Stump Road). Travel to the end of Coldsmith Road. At the stop sign, turn left onto White Church Road. Go about 500 feet and turn right onto Stillhouse Hollow Road. Linda's home is 2119 (third house on left).
