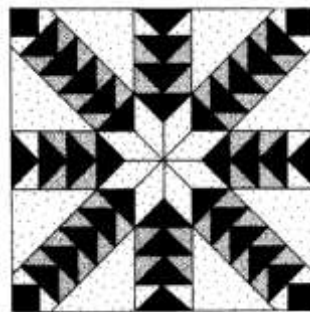

Chambersburg Quilt Guild Meeting Minutes

The Guild meeting was held on 10/10/09 at 1:00pm at Trinity Lutheran Church, **Chambersburg PA**. **The last meeting's** minutes were published in the Bee Line with one clarification: Guests attending workshops will pay an additional \$10.00, and an additional \$5.00 for programs. The minutes were approved by the members. The Treasurer report was given and approved by the members. The Documentation financial report was also given.

Old Business: The president thanked members for volunteering for guild committees. Raffle Quilt: A check for the proceeds from the quilt raffle was presented to Mim Huffman for the Documentation Project. Documentation Book: Books were delivered to the ten sites throughout the County. 550 books sold to date from the 1000 printed. Payment for the fourth phase, \$10,600, was approved by the membership. A discussion was held on how profits from the book should be distributed. No decisions were made. Programs: The morning workshop, **"Borders by Design", with Karen Buckley** was excellent. Round Robin: Group will meet in the back at break to exchange boxes for next round. 2009/10 Raffle Quilt Proceeds: Nominations for a **qualifying organization to receive next year's** raffle proceeds must be emailed to Cindy Bender. Quilt should be finished by next month. 2009/10 Quilt Challenge: **"When I think of Pennsylvania, I think of..."** Make anything quilted. Purse Class next month. Still plenty of openings, Friday 6-8 pm and Saturday 9-12 for this class.

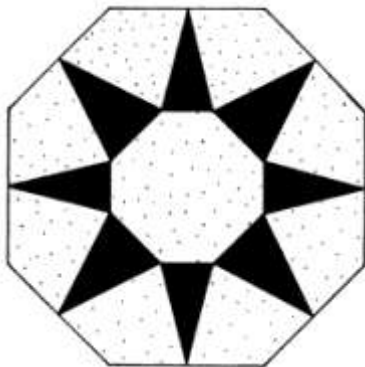

Cumberland Valley Breast Care Alliance

Sharon Brosius, one of the nurse educators, assists newly diagnosed individuals with health care referral, support groups, financial aid and free mammograms to those who need them. This nonprofit organization just celebrated its 14-year anniversary in October. They focus their efforts in 3 related areas--- education, mammagift (free mammograms at Summit Health) and assistance (monetary, care packages, family & patient reassurance). The Freedom Valley Chorus is a part of Sweet Adelines International, a nonprofit music education association for women whose goal is to perpetuate the uniquely American art form -- a cappella harmony, barbershop style. Freedom Valley Chorus was organized in September 2004 and chartered in June of 2007. We have 20 members who love to sing, laugh, and learn. Our weekly rehearsals combine exercises to develop the voice range, tonal quality and breath control, with learning new music, polishing repertoire songs, practicing visual performance and choreography. Performances and competitions help develop our singers' confidence and build pride in their achievements. Singing is the most ancient form of self-

expression and an effective way to counter the everyday stresses of modern life. In addition to singing the women in the chorus have the opportunity to learn and grow by participating in activities such as the management team, costuming, choreography, make-up, set design, scripting, publicity, fund raising, or to be an emcee. We perform at a variety of places such as the Gettysburg Concert in the Park program, the Shippensburg Corn Festival, a Hagerstown Sun's Game, banquets, retail stores, retirement facilities, church functions, and downtown Chambersburg activities. We charge modest fees for these performances and could use more support to help us to encourage more women to sing, to support educational opportunities for our director and assistant director, and each member of the chorus. Sweet Adelines International provides many opportunities for growth on the national and regional level. The most rewarding part of what we do is the opportunities to lift our spirits and the spirits of the people who hear us. None of us will forget the night we donated a performance to the retired nuns in Emmitsburg. They were so appreciative, smiling, and singing along. After the performance, we talked with them and felt their joy in spite of their infirmities. We all felt privileged to have shared some time with them.

If we are privileged to receive support for the chorus, we will look forward to the opportunity to thank you with our singing.

Tip of the day
Provided by Lani Brechbill

Do you love the way a particular quilt batting worked in one of your quilts...but find yourself unable to remember *which* type of batting you used? Why not include this vital detail in your on-going quilt journal, or start a journal to record this and other important data about each quilt you make. A three-ring binder works well for keeping your quilt “documentation” organized and easily accessible.

Chances are you are already documenting some information about your quilts: your name, the name of your quilt, when it was made, for whom it was made, and so on. (If not, you should be!) At the same time, spend a moment or two to include details about the batting you used in the quilt. If possible, include the label from the batting package. If you just take this simple step, you’ll never again need to “unsew” a small area of the binding to peek at the batting.
