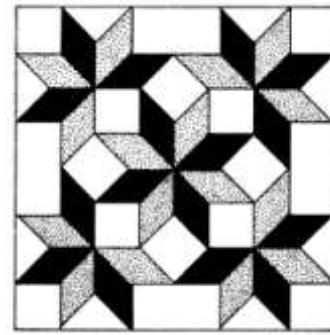
Coming in February – two great quilters

February is the month for hearts, lace, and all the things that remind us of those we dearly love. Reach out to those we love during this special time and tell them. Who knows when we will run out of time.

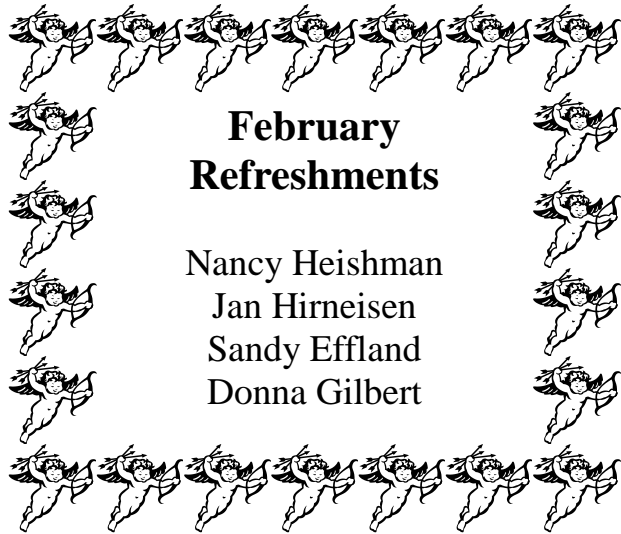

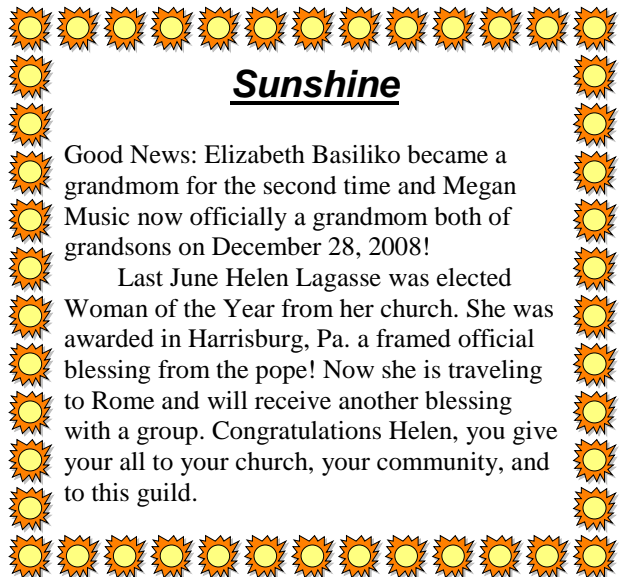

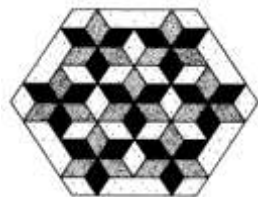

Dessert recipe

During the last Quilt Bee, I served this dessert obtained from a recipe in a coupon brochure. It has been a big hit and very easy to make.

Ingredients:

1 Graham Cracker Crust
2 cups "Europe's Best" Four Berry Blend (found in the freezer section)
1 fresh lemon
1 can sweetened condensed milk
1 small tub "lite" whip topping

In a large bowl, mix the can of sweetened condensed milk with the juice of 1/2 lemon. Using a food processor, pulse or grind the two cups of frozen berries. Add processed berries to bowl and mix into condensed milk. Spread the combined mixture into the graham cracker crust. Place in freezer for one hour. Spread whip cream on top of berry pie, return to freezer for 3 hours or more. Remove from freezer 15 to 20 minutes before cutting and serving.

Bus Trip to Paducah Quilt Show

Would you like to travel to one of the most prestigious quilt shows in the world located in the quaint town of Paducah, Kentucky? Would you like to see the prior Best of Show Quilts at the National Quilt Museum on special **display as part of the show's 25th** anniversary celebrations? There is a bus that will pick you up in this area on April 20 and drop you off in Chambersburg on April 25, 2009. The **Stitch 'N Craft Shop of Manheim, PA is organizing** their 3rd annual bus trip to the **American Quilting Society's Show in Paducah, Kentucky**. The cost will be \$861 double occupancy. This price will include:

All transportation to Paducah and back plus transportation during the show

6 nights of hotels with continental breakfasts

6 dinners, lunch on your own

Admission to the Quilt Show for 3 days

Hancock's of Paducah and
Quilt shops along the way

If you interested you can contact the **owner of Stitch 'N Craft or Toni at (717) 664-4230**. They will be able to answer your questions and send you an application form. Several members of our quilt guild went on the trip last year and enjoyed the show.

SPRING RETREAT

April 17-19, 2009

Again you can go extra nights such as Wednesday, April 15, and/or Thursday, April 16, at an additional fee. This time you can also go on Tuesday, April 14, if you wish. The retreat is held at the Byers Conference Center at the Roxbury Camp in Roxbury, PA. It is a weekend to “eat, sleep, & quilt”. You bring whatever projects you want to work on along with your sewing machine if you want and spend the weekend quilting while the Roxbury staff feed us and take care of everything for us.

It’s a lot of fun and you get to know other members during the weekend. The sleeping rooms are like 5-star hotel rooms. You don’t have to bring anything except what you want to work on for the weekend. Sign-up sheets will be available at the January meeting. You can pay ½ or entire retreat fee when you sign up in January. The total fee must be paid by the April meeting.

The new rates are for 2009, plus Roxbury has to add state tax to the fee this year. To help with the bookkeeping, the fees have been rounded off to the nearest dollar per the Retreat committee. If you have any questions about this, please see Dottie.

The rates for the retreat are as follows:

Weekend rate – this includes 2 nights lodging (Friday & Saturday) and 5 meals starting Friday evening

\$119/person – double occupancy

\$127/person – single occupancy

Extra nights – no food service on Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday

\$38/ night/.person – double occupancy

\$42/night/person – single occupancy

If you are sharing a room with a room mate for the weekend and you want to come the extra nights and your room mate doesn’t, then the extra nights will be at the single occupancy rate for you while the 2 weekend nights will be

at the double occupancy rate for you and your room mate.

If you can’t come for the entire weekend you can come on a daily basis at a nominal fee of \$5/ day unless you order a meal on Friday or Saturday, then you will only pay the cost of the meal.
